WA Digital Inclusion Project: Initiatives

Strategy focus area	Supporting initiatives
Ability	 Train ~1,500 front-line community service workers on the use of digital inclusion resources.
	2. Uplift the digital skills of at least 45,000 people in the community.
	3. Provide 100 scholarships to support people to obtain digital skills credentials.
Access	4. Establish a new digital inclusion website to support up to 50,000 WA community members to access digital inclusion resources and facilities.
	Provide 500 internet plan subsidies in a pilot with social housing residents.
Affordability	6. Provide 500 affordable devices in a pilot with social housing residents.
	7. Train 150 financial counsellors to support at least 1,000 people in selecting the best-fit affordable digital access option for them.




- get affordable access to digital technology

Tips to stay safe online



- If someone is calling you and asking for personal information or access to your computer, take down their details, find their company's number and call them back – or simply hang up!
- If a text or email from a friend or family member seems strange or is asking for money, call them on the number you have for them and ask them to verify the information
- Make passwords long and hard to guess
- Be mindful of what you share on social media.
- Trust your gut don't be fooled by people who are trying to scare you, charm you, or make you rush!

"I didn't ask you to call me, so I am going to hang up the phone now"








Three layers of survey for 2 Initiatives
