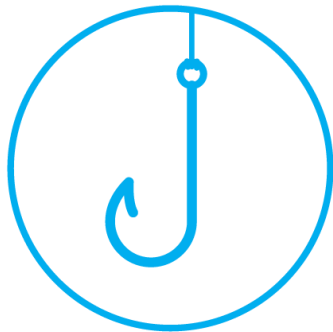

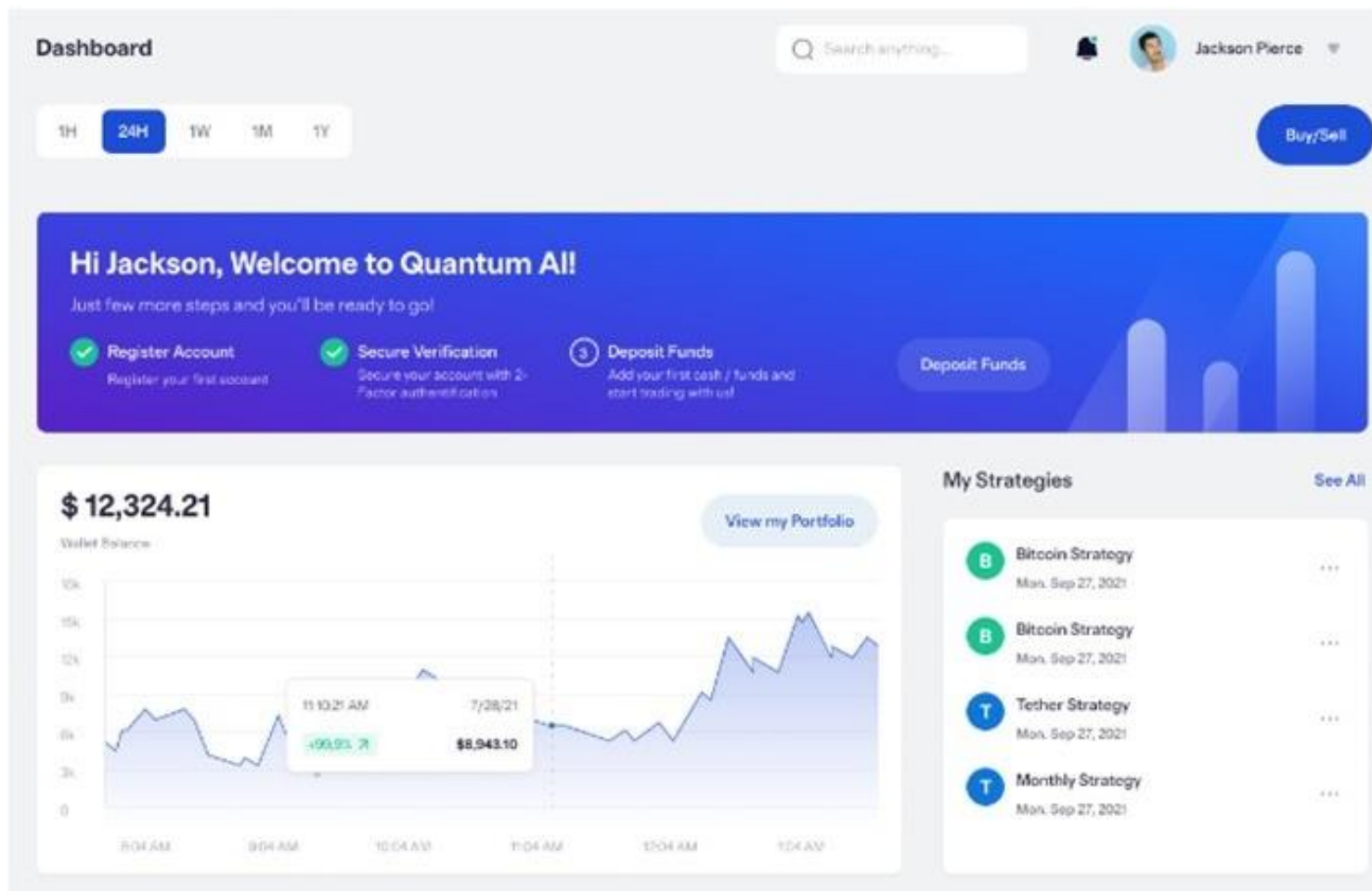

# Investment Scams

- Scammers try to convince you to invest money.
- They say you will get lots of money back with no (or very low) risks.
- They may even have very convincing websites showing your 'investment'.





# Remote Access & Hacking Scams

- Scammers will call you or send you an email to contact you.
- They will ask you to download something, usually pretending to 'fix' your computer.
- This allows them to access your device to steal information saved it.

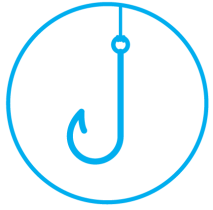




# Online Shopping Scams

- Scammers create fake ads or websites selling products.
- They will take your money and never provide you with the product.





# Phishing Scams

- Scammers send fake emails from someone like the bank or Government.
- They will usually ask you to send them personal information.
- Once they have enough details, they can pretend to be you.

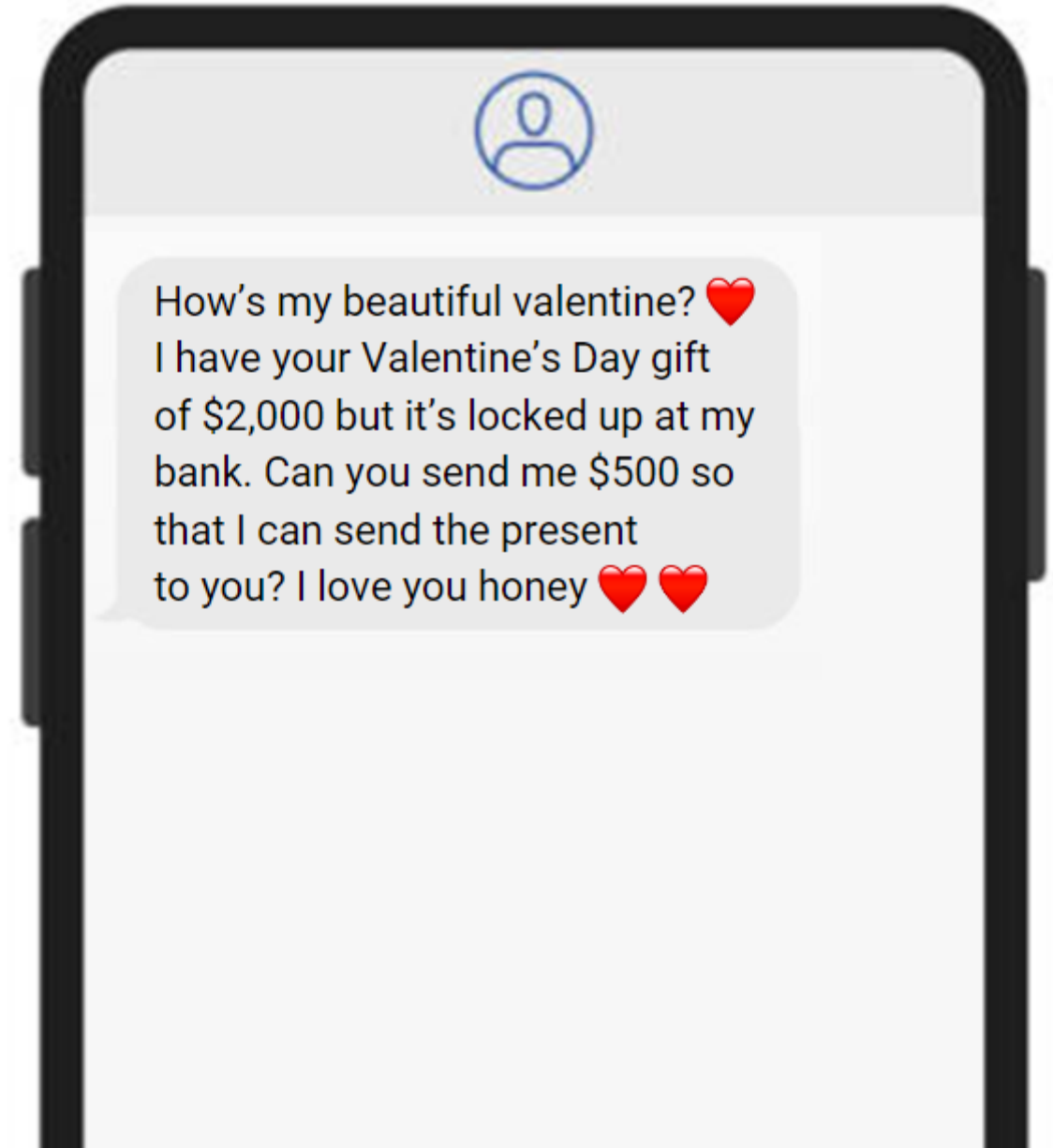
You must attach the IBAN number along with proof that you are the owner of said account, attaching a photocopy of both sides of the Driver's Licence and Medicare Card.

## Romance Scams

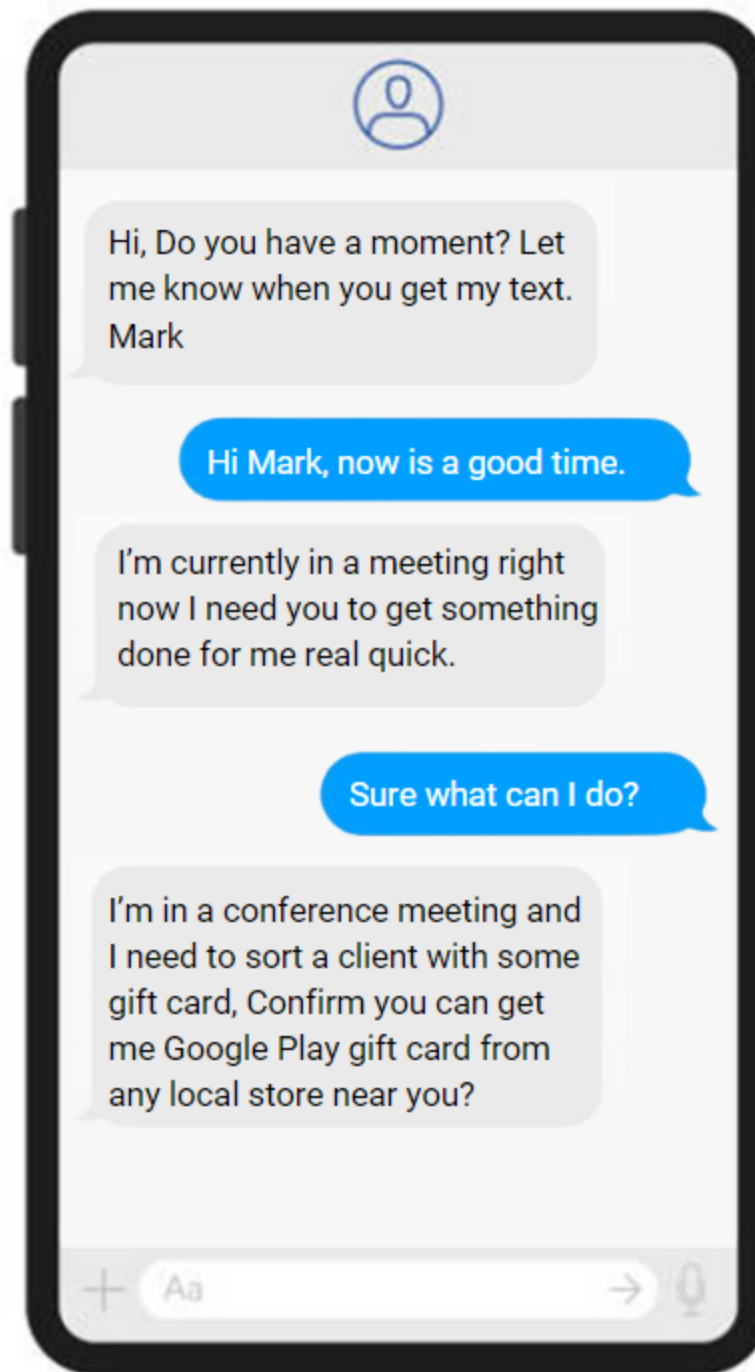
- When a scammer takes advantage of people looking for love online.
- They often pretend to have feelings for you and then ask you for money once you trust them.
- If you are using dating apps or websites, make sure you confirm someone's identity, in person where possible.





## Gift Card Scams

- Scams involve someone convincing you to buy gift cards and provide them with the details.
- Scammers often pose as legitimate businesses, government agencies, or even someone you know.
- They might claim that payment via gift cards is needed to resolve an issue or to help in an emergency.

**Beware of suspicious phone calls.**



**Be cautious with texts you receive.**



**Make your passwords strong.**



**Be careful on Social Media.**

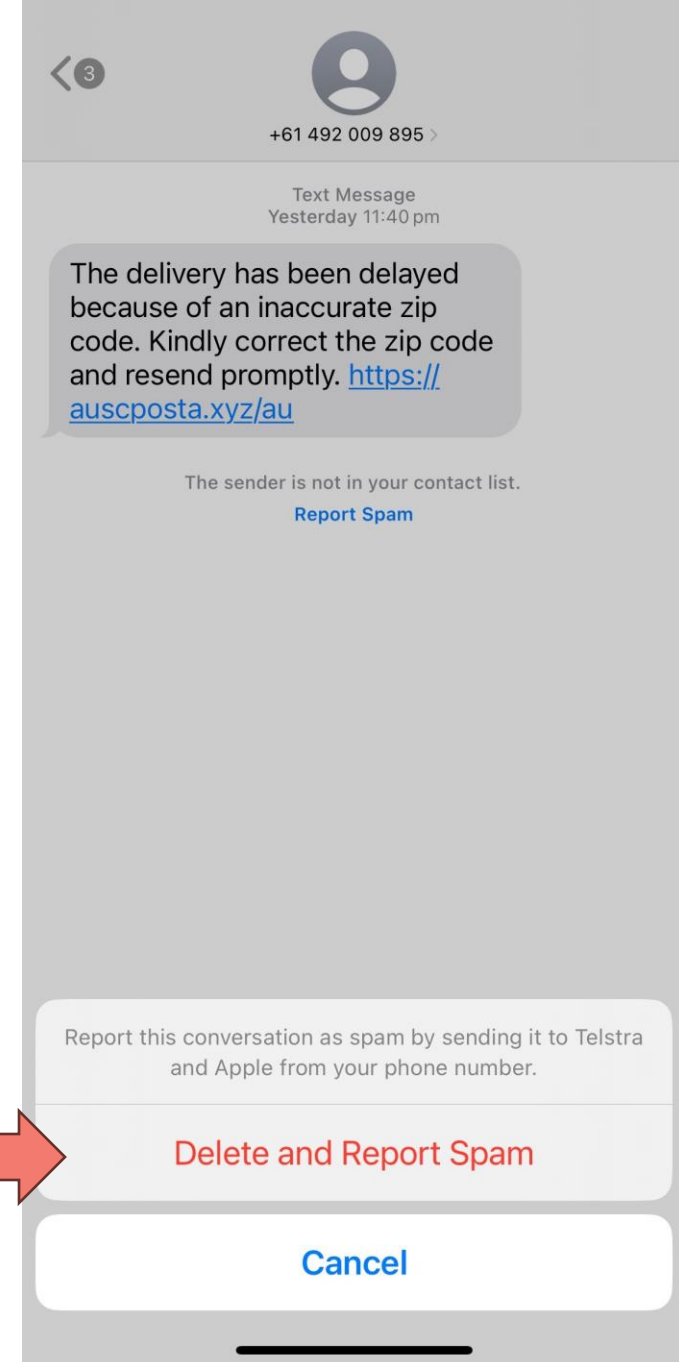

# Scam red flags



## **The Contact**

- They will generally contact you first by phone, text or email.
- They often impersonate organisations or businesses to seem legitimate.



## **The Story**

- They will have a convincing story to hook you into the scam.



## **The Urgency**

- Scammers will pressure you to take action quickly so you don't have time to realise something is wrong.
- They often include fake deadlines or 'limited time' offers.

**Contact** your bank or the company straight away



**Report** to Scamwatch online

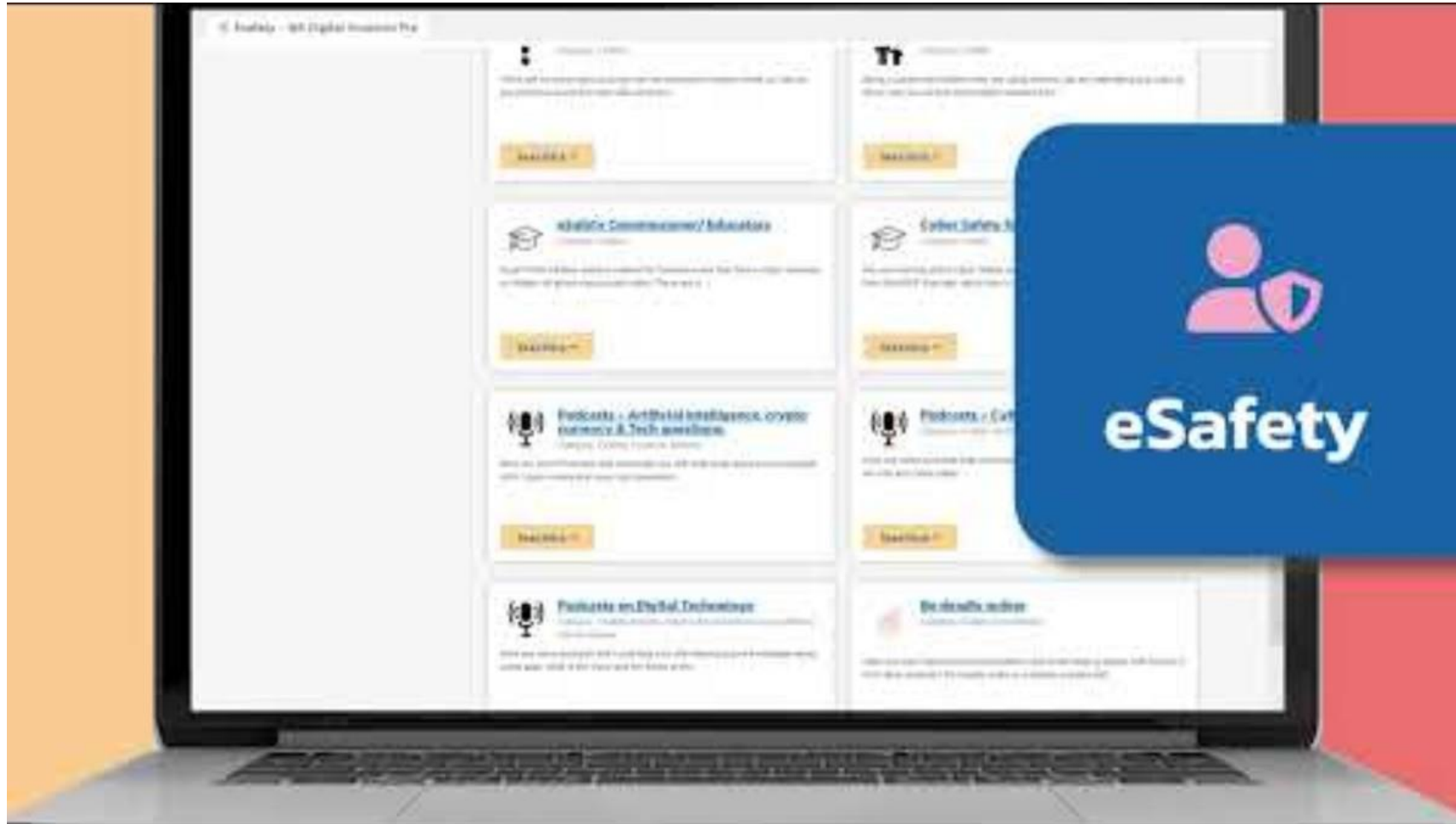


**Call** IDCARE on 1800 595 160 if you've given a scammer your personal details
